CSS

First, in the main section, make sure your page is styled so margin: auto; will center boxes.

html {
    text-align: center;
    background-color: #ccc;
}
```

Then, in the computer only section, add the left and right divisions.

```
section.left {
    float: left;
    width: 48%;
}

section.right {
    float: right;
    width: 48%;
}
```

Then, in the computer only section, style your image so that it will be in the middle of the divisions you create. Style the width to your tastes.

figure {
    width: 80%;
    margin: auto;
}
```

Then, in the computer only section, style the image; adjust the border, background, and padding styling to your tastes.

img {
    max-width: 100%;
    background-color: #fff;
    padding: 3px;
    border: 2px solid #000;
}
